Kimberly Davis, the County Treasurer, reported she spoke with Kristy Kennedy, the Vice President of Marketing at the Plattsburgh-North Country Chamber of Commerce, regarding advertising in the Montreal market. Ms. Kennedy indicated the Chamber has no preferred advertising rates. She will discuss this with Sue Matton, the Vice President of Economic Development, to find out which specific publications to advertise in.

Ms. Davis reported another property was redeemed today which brings the total number of properties scheduled for auction at 75.

# **Liaison Reports**

# Chamber of Commerce - Legislator Read

Legislator Read reported he attended a meeting of the Strategic Tourism Planning Committee on Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>. An update was provided regarding the progress of waterfront development in the City and Town of Plattsburgh.

#### Board of Health - Legislator Beach

Legislator Beach reported the next meeting of the Board of Health is scheduled for Monday, April 13<sup>th</sup>.

## Intercounty - Legislator Waldron

Legislator Waldron reported the Intercounty Legislative Committee of the Adirondacks met Thursday, March 26<sup>th</sup> in Canton, New York. Mark Lavigne of the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) reported "Raise the Age" has been put on hold until further notice so counties have time to adjust to this change.

Legislator Waldron reported a presentation was made regarding multi-use recreational trails in St. Lawrence County. She stated legislation is in the works for Utility Vehicles (UTVs) to be registered in New York State for trail use.

Legislator Waldron reported Clinton County will be hosting the April meeting of the Intercounty Legislative Committee of the Adirondacks on Thursday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>. The meeting will take place at The Champlain Wine Company located at 30 City Hall Place at 10 a.m. Legislator Read will give a brief presentation before the meeting. Lunch will follow at 12 noon at The Ground Round.

#### Soil and Water - Chairperson Dyer

Chairperson Dyer reported the next meeting of the Soil and Water Board is scheduled for Thursday, April 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### Grievance Committee - Legislator Gallagher

Legislator Gallagher reported a Grievance Committee meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, April 15<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m.

# Workforce Investment Board - Legislator Read

Legislator Read reported the Workforce Investment Board (WIB) is going through a transition from one set of Federal rules to another. This is the biggest regulatory change in a generation which will take effect as early as July, and includes a number of key features.

Legislator Read reported the size of WIB has decreased to almost half, down to 19 members, and 13 of those members must be from the private sector, which must make up a majority of each meeting. These members are drawn from the highest local levels of the firms and industries most in need of WIB training.

Legislator Read reported WIB must now develop training programs for the disabled and veterans.

Legislator Read reported that as before, two business organizations must nominate new members to the elected officials who ratify the Board membership.

Legislator Read reported the WIB budget is expected to be submitted to the Legislature in May. The new regulations require WIB to redo its strategic plan at least every three years compared to the previous five-year cycle.

Legislator Read reported the turnover of three Directors over the past few years has been a challenge for WIB. The role of WIB is more essential than ever as there remains high unemployment and underemployment in this region. He stated the four-County area desperately needs an entity to help aggregate the training needs of major employers in this area, and to coordinate the training efforts of groups as varied as Pathways in Technology Early College High School (PTECH), Kindergarten through

Grade 12, CV-Tech, Clinton Community College and Plattsburgh State University College. He stated the Counties stand ready to assist in these efforts.

# **Staff Reports**

County Attorney James Coffey requested an Executive Session to discuss Turtle Island Trust litigation, Narrows Road Bridge litigation and the purchase of real property by Clinton County.

There being no further business, Chairperson Dyer moved on to resolutions. The following resolutions were approved unless otherwise noted.

Resolution #264 was approved.

Legislator Gallagher motioned to exit Executive Session at 8:37 p.m., seconded by Legislator Dame. (Carried 10-0-0).

There being no further business, Chairperson Dyer entertained a motion from Legislator Hall to adjourn Regular Session at 8:38 p.m., seconded by Legislator Dame. (Carried 10-0-0).
